Strategies	Comments
1) Early identification	<ul> <li>Nurse-driven or physician-driven protocol for early identification of patient at risk for CDI.</li> <li>Immediate isolation of patient pending confirmation of diagnosis.</li> </ul>
2) Hand hygiene	<ul> <li>Hand hygiene with alcohol based solution is acceptable prior to patient contact.</li> <li>Hands to be washed with soap and water on exiting patient room after removal of gloves.</li> </ul>
3) Contact isolation precautions	<ul> <li>Measure compliance to contact isolation precautions.</li> <li>Monitoring availability and appropriateness of donning and doffing of PPE.</li> </ul>
4) Dedicated equipment	Use disposable or dedicated equipment per CDI patient.
5) Private rooms	<ul> <li>Use private rooms for CDI patient or cohort with other patients with CDI diagnosis.</li> <li>Dedicated commode per cohorted patient.</li> </ul>
6) Antimicrobial stewardship	<ul> <li>Monitor appropriate antimicrobial use.</li> <li>Antibiotic restriction when applicable.</li> </ul>
7) Environmental disinfection	<ul> <li>Use of household bleach or EPA registered disinfectant for daily and/or terminal cleaning and disinfection of patient room and environment.</li> <li>Monitor environmental services staff for compliance with cleaning and disinfection.</li> </ul>
8) Education	Education of healthcare personnel, patients and families about CDI.
9) Laboratory alert systems	Use of laboratory alert systems directed to Infection Preventionists and Clinicians for early identification of CDI patient.
10) CDI surveillance, reporting and analysis	<ul> <li>Regular CDI surveillance, reporting and analysis to monitor effectiveness of prevention program.</li> <li>Creation of checklist to monitor compliance with bundled approach and cleaning protocol.</li> </ul>
